## So was 4th edition really bad or something? : r/DnD - Reddit

4e was mostly a big change and so controversial, rather than deeply, objectively bad. Planar lore was massively revised, settings were crammed into a single mould, class powers were strongly focused on abstracted tactical combat with little simulationism.

## D&D 4E First timers! : r/rpg - Reddit

A lot of the 4e hate originates from its initial launch, by a lot of angry 3.5 fans, which now continues to be echoed by 5e fans who haven't even played it. Most of us folks here at r/rpg can look back at 4e as a flawed, but brilliant edition of D&D, and many games that succeed it have taken the best aspects of it and improved upon it.

## dnd 4e - What is the real difference between D&D 4th Edition and ...

The errata part is true (errata is incorporated into the Rules Compendium) but you only get a tiny selection of whats available with 4e with Essentials. Most of the classes, most races, most items, the multiclassing rules, the hybrids.. most everything.. are in the other books. Essentials is great, but it's only a basic version of the game.

In fact, D&D 4e likely has tighter balance than any other "crunchy" system ever made—it certainly put more emphasis and priority on it than any other I'm aware of. Balance, of course, is never perfect, and when things are imbalanced, you can categorize the best and worst options into tiers.
