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## Borikén (Boriquen) - Boricua Guide

What Does Borikén Mean? “Borikén” is a name derived from the indigenous Taíno language, referring to the island now known as Puerto Rico. It translates to “Land of the Valiant and Brave Lord,” reflecting the Taíno people’s respect for their leaders and their deep connection to the land.

## History of Puerto Rico - XV Century - 1599

Taíno Indians who inhabited the territory, called the island Boriken or Borinquen which means: "the great land of the valiant and noble Lord" or "land of the great lords". Today this word -used in various modifications- is still popularly used to designate the people and island of Puerto Rico.

The island is also popularly known in Spanish as La Isla del Encanto, meaning "the island of enchantment". [45] Columbus named the island San Juan Bautista, in honor of Saint John the Baptist, while the capital city was named Ciudad de Puerto Rico ("Rich Port City"). [20]
