Requires an agency to take steps to maximize competition and to insure that small and socially and economically disadvantaged businesses are not precluded from performing as prime contractors and subcontractors on contracts for the production or assembly of spare parts.

The Competition in Contracting Act (CICA) of 1984 (41 U.S.C. 253) (H.R. 5184) (FAR Subpart 6.1 "Full and Open Competition") is a Public law enacted for the purpose of encouraging competition for the award of all types of Government contracts.

41 USC 253: Competition requirements - House

(3) For purposes of this subsection, a contract is a new contract unless the work provided for in the contract is a continuation of the work performed by the specified entity under a preceding contract.
