What is denoted by sic is that the word or phrase that precedes it occurs in the original passage being quoted or name being used and was not introduced by the writer doing the quoting.

The adverb sic, meaning 'intentionally so written', first appeared in English c. 1856. [6] It is derived from the Latin adverb *sic*, which means 'so', 'thus', 'in this manner'. [7]

It is used to indicate that something incorrectly written is intentionally being left as it was in the original. Sic is usually italicized and always surrounded by brackets to indicate that it was not part of the original. Place [sic] right after the error. Example: She wrote, "They made there [sic] beds."

When you see [sic] in a document, it simply means that there was an error in the original source material that is being quoted. The writer is letting readers know that the text being quoted has been copied exactly as it appears on the page or screen.
