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2026 ICD-10-CM Diagnosis Code R01.1: Cardiac murmur, unspecified

R01.1 is a billable/specific ICD-10-CM code that can be used to indicate a diagnosis for reimbursement purposes. The 2026 edition of ICD-10-CM R01.1 became effective on October 1, 2025.

ICD-10 code R01.1 for Cardiac murmur, unspecified is a medical classification as listed by WHO under the range - Symptoms, signs and abnormal clinical and laboratory findings, not elsewhere classified .

When a heart murmur is determined to be a symptom of a known underlying heart condition, the R01 code is no longer the primary classification. Instead, the coding shifts to the specific diagnosis causing the turbulent blood flow.

R01.1 ICD 10 Code - Cardiac murmur, unspecified - Billable

R01.1 is a valid billable ICD-10 diagnosis code for Cardiac murmur, unspecified. It is found in the 2025 version of the ICD-10 Clinical Modification (CM) and can be used in all HIPAA-covered transactions from Oct 01, 2024 - Sep 30, 2025.

R01.1 is a billable diagnosis code used to specify a medical diagnosis of cardiac murmur, unspecified. The code is valid during the current fiscal year for the submission of HIPAA-covered transactions from October 01, 2025 through September 30, 2026.
