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How Many Spaces Can a King Move in Checkers?

In American Checkers (the variant played on playcheckers.io), also known as English Draughts, kings can move a single space diagonally in any direction on each turn. In other variants, such as International Draughts, kings are allowed to move as many spaces as they can until hitting another piece.

Checkers King Rules: Movement & Jumps - Holding the Cards

While a normal piece can only move and jump forward, a king can move and jump forward and backward. They can move 1 square diagonally forward or backward and they can jump multiple times if the opportunity is there.

Rules for the King in a Checkers Game - Our Pastimes

Single checker pieces can only move one space at a time, unless they are jumping another piece. However, the king can move forwards AND backwards, which is part of the significance of getting one of your checker pieces "kinged" during the game.

Checkers Rules - FlyOrDie

A King can move in any direction and 'jump' in any direction one or more pieces, as the limits of the board permit. The King can only jump diagonally over one adjacent piece at a time, in any of the four diagonal directions.

Kings may move or capture either backwards or forwards, but otherwise behave the same way as men: the "flying kings" rule is not present in standard checkers.

Can a King Move Two Spaces in Checkers? - ACHIVX

Unlike international checkers where kings can slide diagonally across the board, a king in standard checkers only moves one square at a time diagonally. It's a single-square hop, not a sweeping slide.

How many spaces can a king move in checkers - Draughts

Just as the other pieces (in English Draughts), Kings can only move one space. However, a king is allowed to move either back or forth, while other pieces can only move forward.
