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Kolb's Learning Styles & Experiential Learning Cycle

Kolb states that learning involves the acquisition of abstract concepts that can be applied flexibly in a range of situations. In Kolb's theory, the impetus for the development of new concepts is provided by new experiences.

Kolb's Experiential Learning Theory & Learning Styles

In a concrete experience, each learner engages in an activity or task. Kolb believed that the key to learning is involvement. It is not enough for learners to just read about it or watch it in action. In order to acquire new knowledge, learners must actively engage in the task.

Psychologist David A. Kolb (1939-) used existing theories on experiential theory to create his Learning Style Inventory (LSI) in 1976 as an interdisciplinary tool for measuring the learning styles of students in secondary education and higher education.

Kolb's approach synthesizes goal-directed and behavior learning theories to create a learning cycle

which values process and the ongoing nature of learning. The Kolb learning cycle (Diagram 1) is typically represented by four stages through which the learner repeatedly progresses (McLeod, 2013).
