## **How long does it take to culture rotifers? | Reef2Reef**

Supplies: Clean saltwater (no rotifers in it), Microscope, graduated cylinder (10 mL volume), 1 mL plastic pipettes, 50 mL beaker, microscope, a well slide or Sedgwick-Rafter slide (as long as the slide has a depression volume of 1 mL). 1) Start by measuring 27 mL of clean saltwater in the graduated cylinder and add it to the 50 mL beaker.
