"Proc" is short for "process." In game programming this refers to an event that is triggered under particular circumstances. You can think of it synonymous to "activate" or "trigger." For example, Luden's Echo procs on any source of damage that deals spell effects. Ezreal's Q, although a spell, triggers on-hit (auto attack) effects. Runelgaive procs on any spell cast, making Ezreal's Q proc ...

Proc is used as both a noun and a verb to describe whenever a gaming item activates or a gaming event occurs. When someone is using bleed weapons they want the bleed to "Proc" or activate on you for additional damage.
